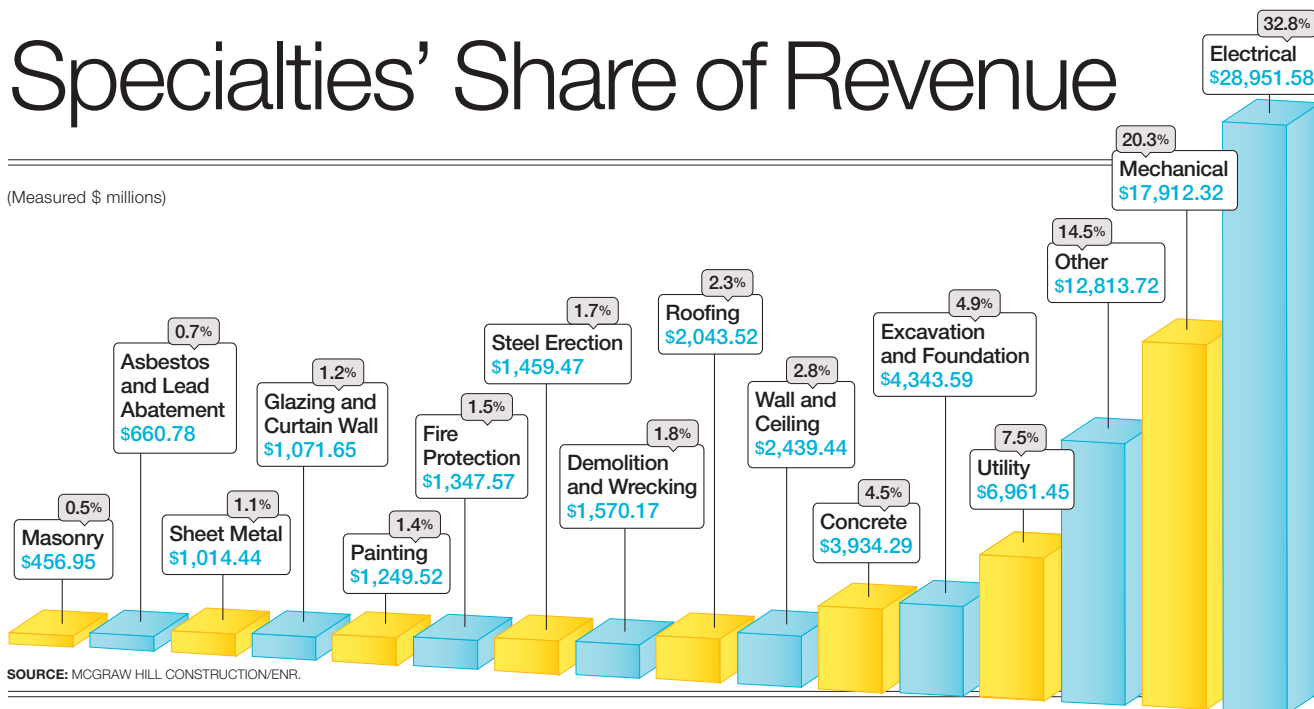
Firms Wary During Recovery

The market has finally come around, but specialty contractors are cautious about chasing opportunities after a long dry spell [By Gary J. Tulacz](#)

The long-anticipated market turnaround has arrived, as most sectors are growing at a healthy, but not overheated, pace. However, with more work to pursue, many large specialty contractors are treading carefully. Many understand that more contractors fail during a recovery than in a recession.

The scope of the recovery can be seen in the results of this year's ENR Top 600 Specialty Contractors list. As a group, the Top 600 cleared revenue of \$88.23 billion in 2013, up 8.5%, from \$81.33 billion, in 2012. The Top 600 revenue figure from 2013 is a record, topping 2008's mark of \$87.07 billion.

Another positive sign for large specialty contractors is that, of the 512 firms on the list this year that also completed surveys last year, 364 (71.1%) had revenue increases from 2012 to 2013, while only 28.5% saw lower revenue in 2013. This percentage is higher than last year's, when just 67.1% of the Top 600 firms had increased revenue in 2012 from 2011.

One significant development on this year's list is that Quanta Services moved into the top position, passing EMCOR Group, which has held the top spot for the past 11 years. Quanta is benefitting from two big acquisitions back in 2009 and 2010: Houston-based oil-and-gas pipeline giant Price Gregory Services and Canadian electric-power-line contractor Valard Construction, respectively. Quanta continues to accumu-

late capacity, having made six acquisitions in 2013. Most of these acquisitions are in the Canadian power-line sector.

The shale-gas boom has powered much of Quanta's growth. "We continue to see momentum in all of our end markets, driven by regulation and the accelerated development of North America's unconventional shale and oil-sand resources," notes James F. O'Neil, CEO, Quanta Services.

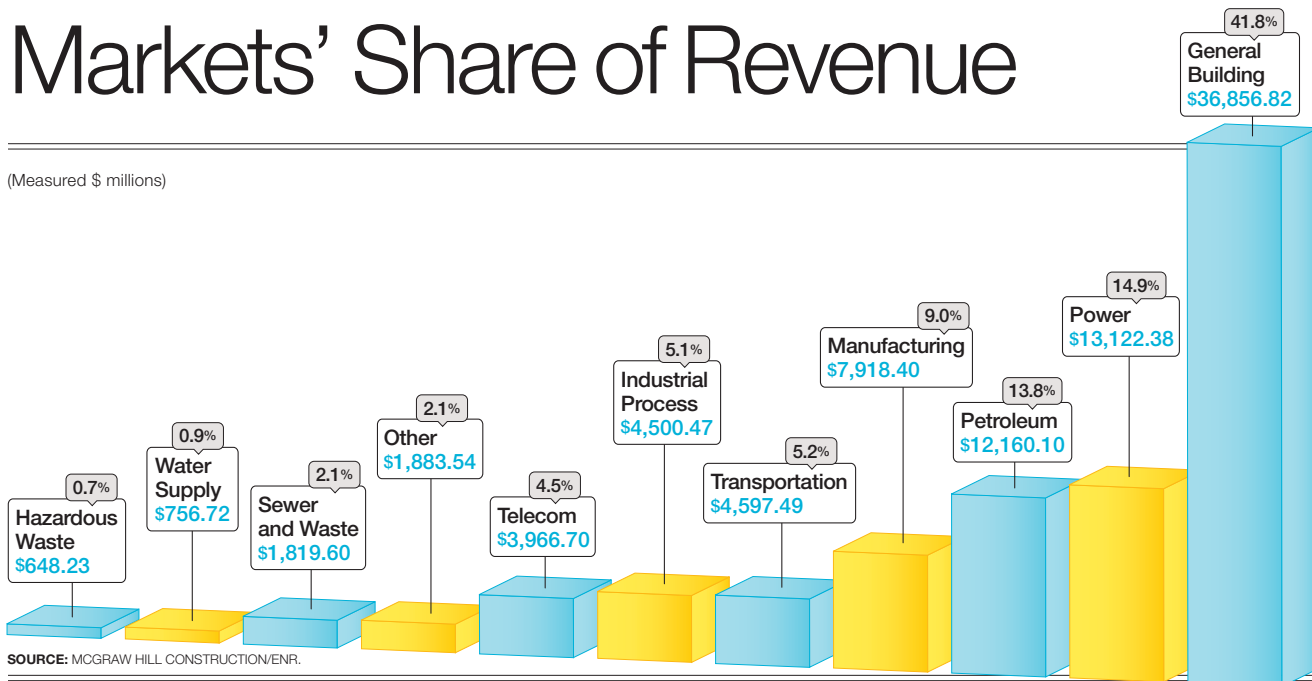
EMCOR also has built a big stake in oil and gas. In July 2013, it acquired La Porte, Texas-based refinery contractor RepconStrickland Inc. "It usually takes about nine months to fully integrate an acquired firm, and this one has worked out really well," says Anthony Guzzi, CEO, EMCOR.

There have been several recent major acquisitions and consolidations involving specialty contractors. In June, MASTEC Inc. acquired Pacer Construction Holdings Corp., a 1,600-person, Calgary-based contractor in the oil-and-gas sector. And, in April, demolition and asbestos-abatement giants LVI Services Inc. and NCM Group Holdings merged to form Northstar Group Services Inc.

Southland Industries has made a couple of acquisitions, but it is focusing on branching out internally. In 2013, it opened an engineering subsidiary to assist in design-build projects. "Southland Engineering helps

us to get into design-build projects at an earlier stage of the design process,” says Ted Lynch, CEO. He says the subsidiary also works as a stand-alone engineering firm, which also could help Southland secure the mechanical work.

Midsize contractors also are expanding their portfolios. Joslin Construction added an earthworks division in 2010, and, this past April, it launched a new paving division. Joslin President Curtis Joslin says clients want one point of contact for a division-two package. “By making ourselves multidimensional, we streamlined processes for our clients and put the early stages of a project squarely on our shoulders.”

Buildings Are Big, in a Small Way

Guzzi is concerned about the buildings market. “Outside of the industrial and petroleum sectors, the market has not moved much,” he says. He believes the overall market will continue to rise but says it won’t be fully back for another two years. “A rising tide raises all boats, but this tide is not rising very fast.”

The Top 600 data seem to back up some of Guzzi’s views. While Top 600 revenue in the manufacturing, petroleum and power markets was up substantially from 2012 to 2013, revenue in the general buildings market grew only 0.2% during the same period.

Guzzi sees opportunities in the buildings market,

but he says many projects, particularly in the health-care and hospitality markets, are small to midsize. “There are medical offices being built but not the big hospital projects. And there are some nice hospitality jobs for smaller contractors, but these projects are not in our core market,” Guzzi says.

Many large contractors are seeing a trend toward smaller jobs. “We continue to see many opportunities, with small to midsize projects growing the fastest,” says Joel Moryn, president of Parsons Electric. He says that, during 2013 and early 2014, some megaprojects got funded, but “we are currently seeing less of those opportunities coming up in the future.”

Many firms are seeing a growing market for buildings in their regions. Roger & Sons Concrete is working on or has won projects for several very large high-rises in the New York City area. “The private building market—commercial and residential—in New York City is growing fast and seems to be sustainable over the next several years. The level of comfort for a sustainable market over the next several years is as high as it has been since 2008,” says Peter Rodrigues, executive project manager, Roger & Sons Concrete Inc.

There is an overall sense that the market has turned and is growing, even if it is not yet booming. “It is a general rule that it takes 10 years to dig out of a long recession,” says Mike Taylor, executive director of the

National Demolition Association, Doylestown, Pa. “We are now in the process of digging out.”

Watching Cash

The expanding market has many industry executives excited to grow their firms back to where they were before the recession. However, many in the industry have been shaken by some major recent defaults by large specialty contractors over the past two years. Trainor Glass, one of the nation’s largest glazing and curtain-wall contractors, closed abruptly in February 2012, disrupting major projects across the country.

But it was the sudden closing of The Truland Group, which ranked at No. 21 on last year’s Top 600 and No. 10 among electrical contractors, that has shaken many in the industry (ENR 8/11-18 p. 16). “It was a big shock when Truland shut down,” says Lynch. He says Truland’s demise has caused many firms to be more careful about their own finances and those of the firms they work with. “We have got our eye on a couple of other firms that may run into trouble,” he says, declining to identify the firms.

Watching for trouble among partners is growing. “We work with a lot of large general contractors, and we know they are doing fine,” says J. Robert Mann, E-J Electric Installation chairman. “But we watch our P’s and Q’s when working with smaller GCs.”

Mann also is troubled by some of his competitors taking on more than they can handle. “We are a big firm with broad expertise and experience,” he says. However, he is seeing smaller firms now competing for projects that are bigger than they are used to, such as the Hurricane Sandy restoration in the New York City metropolitan area. “The trouble is that you won’t find out if they have the capacity to do the work until a year or two down the road,” he says.

A major issue is that, after a prolonged recession, many specialty contractors have burned through their backlogs and are cash-poor. With growing opportunities, many of these firms are looking to jump back into the market to grow quickly to their former size but without the resources to execute the jobs.

“There are more cash-flow problems in a recovery than in a recession,” says E. Colette Nelson, chief advocacy officer for the American Subcontractors Association, Alexandria, Va. She says when a company takes on too much work but does not have the cash, it can lead to financial problems and even defaults.

Nelson says subcontractors are particularly vulnerable in a recovery. Margins have not yet recovered, and subs often have to struggle to get paid on time, putting added pressure on their cash positions. “When it comes to how many days a subcontractor usually has to wait past an invoice’s due date to get paid, 60 to 90 days is the new 30,” Nelson says.

The ENR Top 600 survey bears out some of Nelson’s points. ENR asked what percentage of payments were received late and what was the average number of days late the payment was made. Of the 489 Top 600 firms that provided figures, 114 said the average late-payment period was 60 days or more.

Another issue among specialty contractors is the increasing use of questionable contractors. “We have seen research that up to 50% of construction workers in Texas are paid in cash without benefits or insurance, and up to 25% in California are in the same situation,” says Nelson. She says there still are GCs that will hire subcontractors based solely on price and look the other way about regulatory-compliance issues. “The natural reaction is to pass new regulations to address the issues, but that means added costs and paperwork burdens for law-abiding contractors but not to those who ignore the law from the start,” she says.

Concerns about some firms’ financial health and stability have many Top 600 firms paying close attention to their bidding practices and workload, despite the increasing number of opportunities available. “There hasn’t been a time in our 60-year history when discretion and job selection have been more important than they are today,” says John Boncher, CEO of

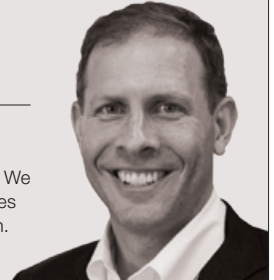

Cupertino Electric. He says there are great opportunities as well as “equally horrible” opportunities out there. “A conscious, thoughtful effort to keep emotions out of the mix and evaluate opportunities on their merits is what keeps us competitive,” Boncher observes.

Many firms are being cautious. “It doesn’t make sense to sign up a bunch of work, take the risk and put strain on the organization for little or no profit,” says Travis Winsor, CEO of The Raymond Group.

The ability to make a profit is a critical factor in taking work. “As contractors get involved in complex, high-speed projects, they need to be aware of the risks they are taking on to perform profitably so that they are around for the next project,” says Tyler Nottberg, CEO, U.S. Engineering Co.

Many contractors worry that their margins remain tight, despite the increase in work. “We set a precedent during the recession on lower construction pricing with owners. They are now slow to recognize the fact that pricing is rising. They’ll have to change their expectations on the cost of construction,” says Tim Chadwick, CEO, MMC Corp.

However, many firms see some of the more onerous practices easing off as specialty contractors have more opportunities to pick and choose what projects and partners to work with. GCs continue to try to commoditize specialty contractors with increasingly restrictive contract terms, which were common when there was an oversupply of specialty firms, says Moryn of Parsons Electric. However, some GCs using these

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commercially unfavorable contracts have begun to find subs refusing to bid their projects, he says.

Costs of Doing Business

But there continues to be competitive pressure on pricing bids. Winsor says non-union contractors are breaking into markets historically marked as union. “Non-union contractors, as a whole, are becoming more sophisticated, and we are seeing them take on more challenging projects,” Winsor notes.

Another area of concern regards the increased costs of complying with new federal and state regulations. “Some industry associations are sounding early alarms about federal regulations to be released over the next few months,” says John Grau, CEO of the National Electrical Contractors Association, Bethesda, Md. He says some NECA members believe that regulations under development over the past few years may start appearing soon. “One of our members calls it ‘regulation strangulation,’” Grau says.

Many contractors complain about the business impact of increasing levels of regulation. “Permits and certifications are required for everything, and this increases the cost of business and the price of production,” says Ben Johnston, executive vice president, Pittsburgh Tank & Tower Inc. For example, he says the Dept. of Homeland Security has made it more cumbersome to obtain Transportation Worker Identification Credential cards and other security clearances. “The workforce is narrowed when only those with a background history check can be hired,” Johnston says.

Materials and equipment prices have been one area in which costs, while rising, have not been a huge burden. “We are not seeing changes in prices, so far, that would be considered significant,” says Moryn of Parsons Electric. “[We see] slight increases in pricing and small changes in availability and lead times,” notes Wayne Searle, CEO of SME Steel.

Staff Shortages

The biggest concern among the Top 600 is the availability and cost of workers for future projects. Worker shortages in the trades are quickly going from a future worry to a current fact of life. As part of the Top 600 survey, ENR asks each firm whether it has experienced shortages in craft labor. This year, 47.8% of the firms on the Top 600 said they had experienced craft shortages. This percentage compares to 37.6% last year, 26.9% in 2012, 21.7% in 2011 and only 14.1% in 2010.

Labor-shortages have begun to put pressure on costs. “Labor prices just keep escalating. It is supply and demand. In the skilled trades, there continues to be a diminishing pool of qualified labor relative to the

volume of work that will need to be performed,” says Nottberg of U.S. Engineering Co.

Worker shortages also are having an impact on bidding and project opportunities. “Many clients who, just a year ago, may have had no problem attracting labor and contractors to participate in their projects are finding themselves challenged to get participation. We are seeing owners and general contractors looking ahead to sign up their preferred contractors before their capacity is gone,” says Clayton M. Scharff, CEO, Sachs Electric Co.

“More than ever, clients are looking for contractors with the available workforce to do the work. They want to know you are technically capable and that you have the workforce capacity to make it happen,” says Dave Crumrine, president of Interstates Construction Services. He says customers have learned what it’s like to get burned by initial low numbers and late jobs. “Having that skilled workforce and implementing efficient ways to leverage them in the field are where it matters ... and will matter for the foreseeable future.”

One of the perennial difficulties is attracting young people to replace retiring baby boomers. “The good

news is that, I think, we are in for good times for the next five years. The bad news is, we have done a poor job recruiting people to do the work,” says Taylor.

Some firms stress that construction should be sold not just as a job but as a career. “We must change the perception of the construction industry among the next generation of potential craft workers and attract employees based on long-term growth and development, rather than a near-term job,” says Bob Pragada, the new CEO of The Brock Group.

Pragada says The Brock Group has been working hard to attract and maintain a sufficient workforce. “We’ve invested years of resources and effort developing a skilled workforce through enhanced training programs, improving our workforce development capabilities and providing career-path opportunities for newcomers into the market place,” he says.

However, changing attitudes in society, especially among young people, can be used to sell construction. “Fifteen years ago, young people getting into electrical engineering all wanted to get involved in the dot-com revolution,” says Lynch of Southland Industries. Now, young people are more interested in the environment

and energy conservation, he says. "The opportunity to build environmentally friendly systems is becoming increasingly attractive to young people."

Many firms are passing on opportunities based on their staffing and becoming more selective in what they pursue. "Our strategy is to hire selectively and consider passing on project opportunities that we don't clearly have the right team available to do," says Moryn of Parsons Electric. He says that, in the past, the firm would have hired aggressively and increased staff count quickly. "We are taking a more conservative approach to growth right now," he says.

Staff shortages have firms worried about talent-poaching by desperate competitors. "Our labor prices have increased in the field and office as we have several tenured employees who deserve the top pay based on their performance. As the skills gap tightens, we see many competitors trying to hire our people, and we try to pay everyone the highest amount possible," David Martin, 4th Generation, H.J. Martin & Sons.

This scenario has led many firms to ramp up their pay and benefits to keep their top performers. "Internally, [W.L. French Excavating Corp., or WLF] strives



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to retain valuable employees by increasing and expanding the company's benefit program," says William L. French Jr., president. He says the firm uses the benefits program to recruit candidates and maintain competitiveness. WLF also continues to find ways to reward employees to demonstrate their value and the team's commitment and dedication, French says.

Some firms also are confronting the level of diversity in the industry. "We do a lot of public work with [minority- or women-owned business enterprise] requirements," says Mann of E-J Electric. He says the firm often has to scramble to find qualified MBEs or WBEs. "We, as an industry, need to do better at developing and mentoring MBEs and WBEs," he says.

Consolidations

The demographics that are affecting the workforce also are affecting the ownership of firms. Increasingly, owners of specialty and subcontractors are approaching retirement age and looking for exit strategies. "We are seeing a lot of companies for sale. I'm seeing three times the number of unsolicited requests to buy companies, most [of which] don't appear to have a succes-

sion plan,” says Boncher of Cupertino Electric. He says smaller electrical contractors are struggling with how to monetize what they’ve spent so many years building. Now, their sole exit strategy is to sell the company. “Because of this trend, I think we’re going to see fewer small contractors and a handful of very, very large contractors.

One firm that has avoided this problem is Giroux Glass. Anne-Merelie Murrell, who bought the company in 1991, announced last year that she would step down as CEO at the end of 2014; for two years, she has been selling her company stock to employees.

Murrell says too many firms do not make transition plans and that may hurt the staff and business. “When you sell a company, the staff does not know what they are going to get,” she says. When employees are shareholders, they are more committed to the firm’s success, she says. “There is an amazing amount of enthusiasm among the staff when you promote from within.” CFO Nataline Lomedico will take over as CEO of Giroux on Jan. 1. “We chose her not because she is a woman but because she has 20 years in the industry, including 13 with Giroux, and is the best person to lead the firm going forward,” says Murrell. ■
